Board of Education Elections

Board of Education elections are nonpartisan elections governed by the general election laws of the State.

Board of Education members are elected at the General Consolidated Election in April of odd-numbered years.

The Board of Education's election duties are:

1. The Board, by proper resolution, may place public policy propositions on the ballot.
2. Members of the Board make up an Electoral Board to hear and rule on objections to candidate nominating petitions and voter petitions.
3. The Board must canvass the precinct returns and declare the results following each election.
4. The Board of Education secretary or clerk serves as the local election official, assisted by designated representatives appointed by the Board.
