

Board of Education Highlights

July 11, 2007 – School Service Center

Recognitions:

- New Superintendent Richard W. Drury was welcomed to the District as he presided at his first D200 school board meeting. Dr. Drury officially joined the District on July 1 after serving the past 12 years as superintendent at the Muskego Norway School District in Wisconsin

The Board took the following action:

As part of the Personnel Report, the Board approved the transfer of Joseph Kish from dean of students, WWSHS, to assistant principal at Franklin Middle School. Mr. Kish was introduced as was Jennifer Tavine the new assistant principal at Hubble Middle School.

Approved membership and dues for the Large Unit District Association (LUDA).

Approved the posting of Policy 6.210, Instructional Materials, including associated forms, for public review. This policy covers the procedures to be followed by a teacher wishing to use an R-rated film in the classroom.

Approved Mobile Classroom Inspections for the 2007-08 school year.

Approved the renewal of the following online resources:

Atomic Learning Online that provides support for students, families and staff to use a multitude of software applications in academic learning assignments.

The Internet search engine and classroom support tool, netTrekker that also includes support for differentiated instruction.

Edline Online Grading which is the interface to post student academic information for middle school and high school parents and students.

Approved bids for Xerographic bond paper and various other paper used by the district print shop.

Approved purchase of a display case for Wheaton Warrenville South as part of the referendum project.

Approved continuation of the Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Wheaton for liaison officers at each high school.

Approved the listed Family and Consumer Science textbooks for 7th and 8th grades.

Authorized submission of the WWSHS e-Plan to the Illinois State Board of Education.

Approved the repaving of the west drive and north parking lot at Monroe Middle School as part of the District's pavement renewal process.

Approved the renovation and relocation of the tennis courts at WWSHS as part of the high school referendum project. The current 6 courts will be replaced with 8 courts which will allow for more student participation and more efficient scheduling.

Approved the buyout of the middle school computer lease agreement. The computers are still working and are viable for District use.

Authorized Legat Architects to proceed with designs for the developmental phase for the proposed Hubble Middle School. Representatives from Legat presented the schematic designs which included initial site and building drawings for the new school. These drawings are available on the District website, www.cusd200.org.
