



District 200 Appoints Acting Superintendent

On October 22, 2009, the Board of Education for District 200 appointed Dr. Charles Baker Acting Superintendent for the remainder of the 2009-10 school year.

Dr. Baker is a familiar face in District 200 and brings a wealth of experience and talent to this new position. In 1972, he joined the district as an English and social studies teacher at Edison Middle School and remained there for eleven years. In 1983, he transferred to Wheaton Central High School as the English department chair.

In two short years, he became assistant principal and in 1988 was named principal. In 1992, the school relocated becoming Wheaton Warrenville South High School and Dr. Baker remained principal until 2004. Following his retirement as principal, he joined the central office administration as director of secondary education.

On accepting the acting superintendent position, Dr. Baker commented, “My tenure in District 200 has provided a strong foundation for an understanding of the issues we face.
