

WNHS Student Parking Regulations 2018-19

Student parking at WNHS is a senior privilege. Only seniors with valid parking tags may park on campus. **Any vehicle parked on campus without a valid parking tag may be towed at the owner's expense.** Parking tags are \$150 for the year and \$75 for a semester (cash or check payable to WNHS). **All outstanding obligations must be paid before you can purchase a parking tag.**

1. Students are only allowed to park in the angled spaces in front of the school on Thomas, in the back lot behind the field house, and the parallel and angled spots on Morse St. Any student parked in an "R," "Visitor," handicapped, or emergency space will be issued the following consequences:
 - 1st Offense – \$10.00 ticket – reduced to \$5.00 if paid within 3 days
 - Subsequent Offenses – vehicle ticketed, stickered, towed and/or parking privileges revoked temporarily or permanently without refund
2. Parking privileges may be revoked without a refund for the following reasons:
 - Excessive absences and/or truancies
 - Excessive discipline referrals
 - Not being in compliance through the Health Office with the meningitis vaccine which is a state requirement for seniors
3. Parking tags are not transferable. Any student found to have obtained a parking tag through any means other than the authorized registration process may be barred from any future parking registration and subject to disciplinary action.
4. Early graduates must return their tag to the Deans' Office. They will receive a refund for the unused semester or be charged for the second semester.
5. The student who purchases the tag is responsible for correct parking and all disciplinary action.
6. Report all lost or stolen tags to the Deans' Office immediately. There is a \$10.00 charge for a replacement tag. A student may **NOT** park on campus without a replacement tag.
7. The speed limit is 5 mph on campus. Any speeding or reckless driving may result in disciplinary action and/or temporary or permanent revocation of parking privileges.
8. Cell phone use while operating a vehicle on school property is prohibited and may result in disciplinary action.
9. Students may not visit the parking lot during school hours without permission from the Deans' Office.
10. Vehicles may be searched if there is a reasonable suspicion that the student has violated a school rule.
11. Vehicle problems, parking problems, or a forgotten tag does not result in an excused tardy or absence.
12. The school is not responsible for any theft or damage that may occur to a vehicle parked on campus.
13. All accidents on school property must be reported to the Deans' Office immediately.
