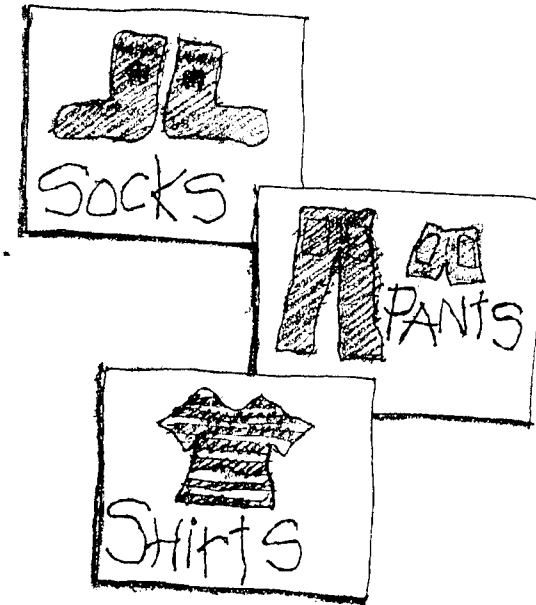


## Activity

# Sorting

- Encourage your child to put things in different piles (e.g., letters and magazines when sorting mail) or containers (white clothes in one basket and colored clothes in a other when doing laundry).
- Have your child look for one type of thing in pictures (Find things that are red).
- Make a scrapbook about something your child is interested in (e.g., animals). Have one page for each type of animal (e.g., dogs, cats, horses, alligators). Help your child paste pictures of animals on the right page.

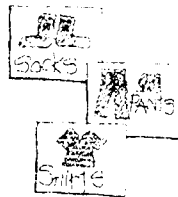


# Sorting



*To help your child succeed, you can:*

- Have your child put together one set of things (e.g., groceries in a bag, coins in a wallet, toy cars in a garage).
- Have your child match things (See this black pebble. Can you find another one?).
- Have your child put together things that come in pairs (socks, shoes).



*To make this activity more challenging, you can:*

- Talk about why objects belong together (These are all blue and these are all green).
- Help your child make groups of things (cherries and strawberries) that belong to a same bigger group (fruit). Help your child understand that each small group is part of the big group (Cherries and strawberries are both fruit). Ask your child if there are more fruit than cherries; or more cherries than fruit.
